There were eight commissions identified, in line with the National Health Research Committee policy, and some of these were adapted to the province. The commissions are structured in such a way as to focus on all the identified recovery focus areas: maternal and neonatal healthcare; health and wellness; mental health recovery; current innovations in healthcare for optimising operations; and management systems.
